RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Registration is open to individuals, businesses, schools, churches, nonprofits, clubs, and auxiliary groups.
2. Registration cost is \$50 per entry. Registration fee must be paid in-full by March 1 to be eligible to compete.
3. Registration includes one table to be used by competitors to serve their chili and promote their organization.
4. Competitors are responsible for decorating their own tables and supplying their own signage, etc. All materials and signage must be kept on or attached to the table provided.
5. PDMCSC will supply cups, spoons, napkins, and bowls. Competitors are responsible for supplying their own serving utensils, cooking supplies, fuel, serving dishes, and extension cords.
6. For the sake of this competition, "chili" will be loosely defined as a hot stew, though creativity may be shown in regards to interpretation.
7. Entries must be prepared in a sanitary environment and free of any hazardous or dangerous substances. It is each competitor's responsibility to ensure the quality and safety of their food. This includes making sure meats and veggies are within date and safe for consumption.
8. PDMCSC will not be held responsible for food safety issues presented by competitors. By entering, each competitor commits to accepting liability for any problems or health effects that may arise as a result of food safety issues.
9. The event will be a "People's Choice" where votes are cast by donations. Each table will have a PDMCSC container for donations. The winner and runner-up will be the competitors that raised the most money. All donations will be designated to the Percy & Donna Malone Child Safety Center.
10. Chili competitors should arrive to OBU Cliff Harris parking lot no later than 10:15 am. Chili will be served from 10:30 am until noon. Contest will end at noon, and winners will be announced by 12:15 pm.
11. Competitors are responsible for cleaning up their own tables and the ground surrounding it, as well as collecting trash and moving it to the appropriate garbage containers.
12. Competitors may not play music or set-up any kind of sound amplification/stereo devices.
13. Each booth, regardless of representation, should be kept family-friendly and free of vulgar or profane images, language, speech, or materials.
14. Each competitor agrees to promote the friendly, community-building spirit of this competition. This means treating everyone with respect and responding cordially to the results of the competition.
